The conflict is known by several names. In British America, wars were often named after the sitting British monarch. such King William's Queen Anne's War. cause there had already been a King George's War in the 1740s. British colonists named the second war in King George's reign after their opponents, and thus it became known as French and Indian War. This traditional name remains standard in the United States, although it American Indians fought on both sides of the conflict.
