

The treaty of 1835 established terms under which the entire Cherokee Nation ceded its territory in the southeast and agreed to move west to the <u>Indian Territory</u>. Although the treaty was not approved by the Cherokee National Council nor signed by Principal Chief <u>John Ross</u>, it was amended and ratified by the <u>U.S. Senate</u> in March 1836, and became the legal basis for the forcible removal known as the <u>Trail of Tears</u>.
