



Rumors throughout the Carolina backcountry during the frontier war of the American Revolution, claim British Indian agent Alexander Cameron is inciting Cherokee warriors to attack frontier settlers as a way of restoring British rule. Cameron had sent letters warning settlers of impending Cherokee attacks, but the letters backfire. Torn between his responsibility as a father, honor to his king, loyalty to the Cherokees and duty to his conscience, Cameron sinks deeper into turmoil, as he realizes his noble attempts to save innocent women and children have become his undoing.

Cameron, on the run from militiamen hell-bent on his capture, fled his plantation near present Abbeville, S.C., moved deeper into the Indian country, and took up residence with his ally Dragging Canoe who also struggled to overcome repression in his quest for freedom.
