6th ANNUAL CHEROKEE NATIONAL HOLIDAY ART SHOW

One painting, "A Declaration for Independence", and two ink drawings, "Statehood-1907" & "Where Angels Fear to Tread", by Ron Mitchell, were accepted for inclusion into the Cherokee National Holiday Art Show for artists of Federally recognized tribes.

The show opens Friday, September 2, at the Tahlequah Municipal Armory Center, (100 S. Water, Tahlequah, Oklahoma), and will be awarding \$10,000 in prize money at the Awards Ceremony and reception 6:30pm that evening.

The hours of the show are: Friday-1:00pm to 8:00pm, Saturday -10:am to 7:00pm, Sunday - 10:00am to 5:00 pm.

In 1907 "Oklahoma Territory" and "Indian Territory" became the state of "Oklahoma" marked on statehood day with a ceremonial wedding of a Cowboy and Indian.
